RAMBERT SCHOOL ADMISSIONS POLICY 2020-21

for 2021-22 entry to Undergraduate Programmes:

FD Ballet & Contemporary Dance

BA (Hons) Ballet & Contemporary Dance (one-year top-up programme)

The Rambert School of Ballet and Contemporary Dance ('Rambert School') offers places based on talent and potential for training alone (i.e. not discriminating on the basis of gender, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, disability, economic background or otherwise); and considers each particular applicant's suitability for the programme of study. Rambert School, in union with the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama and its other Member Schools, operates an equal opportunities policy; for further information, go to www.cdd.ac.uk/about/equality-and-diversity/.

Students of the Rambert School of Ballet and Contemporary Dance are registered as students with the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama, a higher education public funding provider.

Applications

Applications are accepted from around 1 October each year for entry the following academic year. Information about the application process will be displayed on the school website. Application forms are available to download from the school website.

Application Form information

The questions on the application form will be designed to provide only the information needed for the school to make a decision as to whether the candidate can be invited to audition. The application form will also include questions in line with our equal

opportunities policy and are used to provide statistical information only and do not form part of the audition process.

Application process

Only applications received with the administration fee will be processed. On receipt of the correct fee and information, the application form will be processed by the Head of Admissions, Registry & Student Support or staff supporting her; there is no guarantee of an offer of audition, and the final decision lies with the Principal of the school.

The administration fee of £50 is non-refundable.

Entry to Rambert School from September 2018 onwards is through a two-stage audition process. Candidates invited to formal auditions will be considered by a panel of Rambert School teaching staff and a member of the Screening, Treatment and Rehabilitation Unit (STRU).

If an applicant is not selected for audition, they will be informed of the decision by email **within two weeks** of application.

Stage 1 Auditions

As a result of Covid-19 and the current social distancing restrictions in place in the UK, Stage 1 of our audition process will be via digital audition.

Applications open on the 1 October 2020 and close on the 1 March 2021.

Digital auditions will only be accepted if an applicant has completed an application form and paid the application fee of £50.

Digital audition criteria will be on our “apply” page on our website on 14 December 2020.

Digital auditions will be considered by the Principal & Artistic Director and The Deputy Principal.

The digital audition criteria will be available on the 14 December 2020. Students who have made an application and paid their application fee prior to this date will receive the digital audition information on the 14 December. Students who apply after the 14 December and before the 1 March will receive the digital audition link once their application has been processed and their application fee paid.

Digital auditions can be submitted between 4 January 2021- 5 March 2021.

Applicants will be advised if their Stage 1 audition (digital) has been successful within 14 days of submitting their digital audition.

Stage 2 Auditions:

Candidates will complete a ballet and contemporary dance class, pointe work (for applicants on pointe) and candidates will be asked to perform a Solo/attend a physical assessment /be interviewed. Stage 2 audition dates will be published on the school website.

All candidates will be notified of the outcome of auditions normally within 48 hrs of audition.

Panel members will make notes on the classwork to form the basis of the decision to offer a place. All audition notes will be kept for one year.

Overseas auditions

Overseas auditions periodically take place in Japan, Singapore, Australia, Canada and USA. Please see our international students page on our website for further details.

Audition Outcomes

Offer of a place

A candidate who is offered a place should normally expect to hear their result within two weeks of their Stage 2 audition. The candidate will need to accept that place within two weeks of the offer by returning an acceptance email and paying a deposit via bank transfer or cheque which will be offset against their fees or refunded in the third term of the first year of the course.

Reserve List

Candidates may be offered a place on the Reserve List. Students should normally expect to hear within two weeks of their Stage 2 audition. A reserve place may be offered up until the start of term. Only when the term has formally started will the reserve list students be informed that they have not been offered a place on this occasion. The decision to offer a place from the reserve list is at the discretion of the Principal.

Not offered a place

A candidate who is not offered a place should normally expect to hear within two weeks of audition. Candidates who are not offered a place are allowed to apply again for the following academic year's entry.

Offer of a place to overseas candidates

Where a successful candidate is applying as an overseas student, the school will ask for a copy of either their passport or where appropriate their residency status, in order to determine whether they will need a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) issued in order to progress a visa application.

The status will also determine whether they are eligible to pay UK fees rather than the overseas fee. Where a candidate has been either resident abroad or has been living outside of the UK for more than three years, they will be eligible to pay the overseas fee even if they possess a UK passport.

For applicants with English as a second language they will be asked within the application form to achieve a Level B1 in accordance with the UK Visa & immigration (UKVI) Regulations.

Admissions to BA (Hons) Ballet & Contemporary Dance 'Top Up' course after the Foundation Degree.

Successful completion of the two year Foundation Degree Ballet and Contemporary Dance does not guarantee admission to the one year BA (Hons) Ballet and Contemporary "top up" course.

Progression to the BA (Hons) will depend on assessments made by Rambert School faculty staff of students during their second year of the Foundation Degree and potential to succeed at BA level.

Warning that students may not be suitable for the BA (Hons) programme will be communicated to students by the Spring half-term holiday in year 2 of the Foundation Degree programme.

False, fraudulent or misleading information provided by applicants

Rambert School expects that all information provided to it by applicants will be complete, true and accurate, with no misleading omissions or inaccuracies. Any submission of fraudulent, inaccurate or misleading information on the application, or the omission of relevant information, will result in the immediate cancellation of the application and/or the withdrawal of any offer made. Where information comes to light that an application may contain false, fraudulent or misleading information from a successful applicant who has already registered as a student with Rambert School, the student may be subject to disciplinary action.

Admissions Appeals and Complaints

A candidate is only permitted to appeal against the process of audition, there is no right to appeal the decision of the audition panel, and the audition panel decision is final. If a candidate feels they were treated unfairly at audition, they should follow the Admissions Complaints and Appeals Procedure below.

Criminal Records

Rambert School have a responsibility to provide a secure, safe environment for staff, students, visitors and others, and must balance this alongside any legal requirements, such as those to protect vulnerable individuals.

Having a criminal record is not a bar to training at Rambert School. Applicants should note that in the 3rd year BA (Hons) (Top up) students have an opportunity to take part in some widening participation that involves regulated activity¹. This will require students, once they have registered on the programme, and if they opt to participate in this project, to undertake an enhanced DBS check. In certain cases whilst not preventing an individual from training with Rambert School, a criminal record disclosed by an enhanced DBS check may preclude them from undertaking such regulated activity.

From September 2018, Rambert School will process any information relating to a criminal record in line with the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama's Criminal Records policy, which is published on the Conservatoire's website at <http://www.cdd.ac.uk/policies/student-related-policies/>.

Conservatoire for Dance and Drama Admissions Policy Statement:

The Conservatoire for Dance and Drama exists to train artists who will match the world's best and, on entering their professions, shape the future of dance, drama and circus arts. Established in 2001, the Conservatoire is a Higher Education Institution with a unique

structure, comprising six Member Schools. All of these are small, specialist institutions with international reputations for high quality delivery in their respective fields.

Conservatoire students are registered jointly with the Member School and the Conservatoire. The Member School determines its own approach to admissions within the following guidelines.

Member Schools of the Conservatoire will:

- audition all applicants that meet the basic criteria for the discipline and programme as outlined by the Member School;
- accept individuals based on talent and potential for training alone (i.e. not discriminating on the basis of gender, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, disability, economic background or otherwise); and
- consider each particular applicant's suitability for the programme of study.

Applicants must demonstrate:

- the ability and capacity to study at the higher education level within a conservatoire setting;
- the facility to receive and potential to benefit from vocational training;
- evidence of suitable preparatory training and/or experience;
- an awareness of the rigours of the training and its vocational nature;
- an understanding of the nature of the industry; and
- an understanding of the aims and objectives of the programme.

Equality and Diversity

Celebrating diversity and working to achieve the creative potential in all our students, is at the heart of the work of Rambert School. As part of the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama, the School is committed to selecting, training and supporting students, regardless of ethnicity, gender, disability, age, sexual orientation or religion. Applicants to Conservatoire schools are chosen solely on the basis of their talent and potential to develop the skills required for their chosen profession. The School does, however, judge applicants on their suitability for a programme and their potential to successfully complete the training, as the work is rigorous and requires high levels of energy and commitment.

In our admissions process, we are committed to supporting students with disabilities. Disabled students are encouraged to disclose their support requirements so that we can endeavour to meet them during the audition process and subsequent training.

We recognise that everyone is an individual and we will work with students to identify potential barriers to training and do what we can to remove those barriers. We will also make any necessary reasonable adjustments, to ensure that disabled students can train at Rambert School.
