UNLOCK CREATIVE POTENTIAL

In the past five years, the number of bursaries awarded to our students has more than doubled yet there is more work to do. The need far outstrips our capacity to support. Last year, the School awarded £309,000 but we could have doubled that figure if we had met all the needs and had the funds available.

We strongly believe in promoting equality, diversity and inclusion across our art form and work to change the landscape of dance. It is our mission to make our training inclusive and accessible to all who have the talent and potential to succeed regardless of means.

To realise this mission, we must increase the financial support we give, and we need your help to fulfil this.

Our goal is to raise additional funding of £300,000 per year. These new funds will provide:

- **10 full scholarships**
- **Bursaries of £5,000 to all our UK students with household income of less than £25,000**

Rambert School is not a place of privilege. Many of our students come from low-income families and find it difficult to support themselves during their three years of training. The demanding schedule of classes, rehearsal, and self-practice makes it difficult for them to seek part-time work to support themselves. Whilst many will take student loans, this does not cover the additional expenses associated with a vocational course such as dance wear, pointe shoes, and audition fees. We want to ensure we remove those financial barriers and providing bursary support is how we can do this.



BE PART OF THE FUTURE OF DANCE

At Rambert School we are leading the way in global dance education. We are a place of innovation, excellence, and creativity. We deliver degree programmes within the higher education sector and attract the very best in dance talent to our course.

We nurture and develop thinking artists with world class technical ability. Our graduates go on to have outstanding careers as dancers, choreographers and artistic leaders and have a profound impact on the dance sector internationally.

Through our work we are both feeding the dance profession and influencing it.

Our graduates can be seen in many international dance companies including Akram Khan Company, BalletBoyz, Ballet Black, Danish Dance Theatre, Hofesh Shechter Company, Mark Bruce Company, National Ballet de Marseille, New Adventures, Nederlands Dance Theater, Phoenix Dance Theatre, Pilzen Ballet, Rambert Russell Maliphant Company, Scottish Dance Theatre, Sydney Dance Company, and Wayne McGregor.



TRANSFORM THE LIVES OF OUR STUDENTS WITH A GIFT

We rely greatly on the generosity of individuals, corporates, and charitable trusts and foundations to support the work we do and are enormously grateful for every gift we receive. £250+ per year will help towards the associated costs of training including dancewear. Pointe shoes alone can be £100, and dancers can need several pairs at a time for class and performance.

£1,000+ per year can support our international students with costs associated with studying abroad including flights.

£5,000+ per year can make a significant difference in relieving financial anxiety for a student. Many of our students come from low-income households and find it difficult to support their living costs.

£10,000+ per year can offer a UK student a fee-free place. Every young person should have the opportunity to access excellence in higher education. For many, the tuition fees stand in the way.
