

The Standards of the Rambert School Code of Behaviour

All members of the Rambert School community are expected to adhere to this Code of Behaviour and are therefore asked to:

- a) Create and maintain the relationship of trust and confidence between you and the School community
- b) Be a polite, courteous, and responsible citizen, look out for other members of the School community and beyond be an active bystander. Comply with instructions as required (including government instructions in the event of a pandemic or other crisis)
- c) Show consideration and respect at all times towards others, irrespective of role, position or background
- d) Create and maintain an inclusive and supportive learning environment and pastoral environment for all
- e) Show empathy with others. Accept that others may not necessarily share your point of view, and be respectful of differences of opinion. Recognise that people do not all start from the same starting points, and that individuals may face very different challenges and obstacles
- f) Take the time to get to know your peers, be supportive of them and those who work with you at all levels and seek to understand their point of view
- g) Be aware of the need for reflection and independent study in taking responsibility for your own learning and development, and in order to see genuine progress
- h) Adhere to all Rambert School Student and Staff Codes of Conduct
- i) Understand and be familiar with Rambert School's definitions of unacceptable behaviours as defined in the <u>Rambert School Policy on Sexual Misconduct</u>, <u>Harassment and Related Behaviours</u> and <u>Rambert School Non-Academic Misconduct Policy</u>. It is just as important for staff as well as students to understand these definitions
